




With their connotations of abundance, cheerfulness, and friendship, chrysanthemums imbue all these qualities on November-borns.

Brats, hot dogs, and buns will be provided. If someone prefers hamburgers, they will need to provide their own. Please bring side dishes and dessert.






Joy Paint Party Saturday, Nov. 11th at 12:30

I (Dan Norford) apologize for taking so long to update you on the activities of the Call Committee. We have had our first two formal sessions:

On Friday, September 8, the Call Committee began the official process of drafting the Ministry Site Profile, a document that is expected to take no less than six months to put together. During our first session, we focused on the crucial importance of keeping the congregation informed throughout this process. The first step will be recording the congregation's responses to two questions. These questions were planned to be presented in activity during the announcement sections of worship on the 10th and 17th of September. We made plans to call any members who were not in attendance or who attend virtual worship.

On Sunday, October 15, the Committee began processing Joy's responses to the survey questions as it continued to work towards the Ministry Site Profile.
