# Joy Choir Practice Begins!


Wednesday, September 13th at 7:00 p.m. through Wednesday, October 4th.

#### Lydia Quilt Group





# A Message from Tina Massey Family Promise Director

#### Did you know...

Due to the current housing crisis in our community, FPTC has extended our program to meet the needs of the families we serve. Until recently our apartment shelter program had a maximum stay of 90 days and although the families were grateful for the time, that was simply not enough. With 95% of housing in Tulsa currently occupied there is simply not enough affordable housing for everyone who needs it. We believe it was necessary to expand our program and provided additional time for families to find and secure housing and not have the added burden of doing that in 90 days or less.

Our goal is to provide an opportunity for a better life for the children and families we serve. We never want to pull a family out of homelessness to put them right back in. As a result, we have increased the stay to a max of 150 days, if needed, to ensure the success of the families we serve. Yes, that will decrease the number of families we serve each year, however, it will also give them the time they need to get their life on track and become self-sufficient.


## Current Wish List: ALDI GIFT CARDS \$25.00 and \$50.00
